



These rules have been adopted to enhance the enjoyment of the Club by all members. Please take the time to familiarize yourself with them. All rules of Spanish Wells Golf and Country club are always applicable whether posted on the club property.

GOLF CARTS

A. GOLF CART GENERAL RULES AS SUGGESTED BY MANAGEMENT

1. Operation of a Club golf cart is at the risk of the operator. Cost of repair to a Club golf cart which is damaged by a member will be charged to the member or, in the case of damage by a guest, to the sponsoring member. Golfers using a Club golf cart will be held fully responsible for any and all damages other than fair wear and tear to the course, to Club property and to the golf cart, that are caused by the misuse of the golf provided cart by the golfers or their guests, and the golfers shall reimburse the Club for any and all damages the Club may sustain by reason of misuse.
2. Golf carts provided by the Club shall not be used by anyone on the property of the Club without proper cart assignment and registration in the pro shop.
3. Each operator of a Club provided golf cart must have a valid automobile driver's license.
4. Club provided golf carts may not be used off the golf course.
5. Club provided golf carts must be promptly returned to the staging area after completion of the round.
6. No more than two (2) carts per foursome is preferred.
7. Obey all golf cart traffic signs.
8. Golf carts are not permitted on any tee area. Parking of golf carts is allowed in designated areas only.
9. Always use golf cart paths where provided, especially near tees and greens. Use the 90 degree rule and cross fairways only at right angles, following each tee shot.
10. Golf carts are to be operated on golf cart paths only on all Par 3 holes unless otherwise designated.
11. Except on cart paths, do not drive a golf cart within fifty feet of a tee or a green.
12. "Course Closed" or "Hole Closed" signs are to be adhered to without exception.
13. Walking play of the golf course will be permitted on days and times determined by Club Management. Walkers are required to carry sand for divot repair.

B. PHYSICALLY HANDICAP GOLFER RULES & GOLF CART OPERATIONS

1. In order to get a handicap flag you must have a handicap card for your automobile issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles in the state in which your car is registered for your use only, or a letter from your doctor. You must sign a statement in the pro shop that you will abide by the rules. The handicap flag must be renewed annually.

2. Spanish Wells issued handicap flag to members will be only issued by the Pro Shop at a cost of \$30.00 and must be displayed at all times on the cart only when the handicapped player is using the cart on the course. Handicap flags are to be used only by the individual issued the handicap card by the DMV or the recipient of a letter from a doctor. Spouse is not authorized to use the handicap flag.
3. Those with an authorized/issued handicap flag must operate their cart in the following manner:
 - a. Drive to your ball on a 90 degree angle from the golf cart path or from the rough using the golf cart path as much as possible.
 - b. Those holes with a white stake located by the greens are the only designated cart parking area.
 - c. Driving on the fairway of a par three hole is permitted unless the fairway is roped off, the hole is marked "Cart Path Only," or the entire course is marked "Cart Path Only".
 - d. Driving to the front of the green is prohibited.
 - e. Driving on the fairway in order to accommodate a non-handicapped person is not permitted if the hole is indicated as "Cart Path Only". The cart may be taken onto the fairway to accommodate the handicapped person only.
 - f. Obey all other golf cart operation rules and direction signs on the golf course.

C. PRIVATE GOLF CART RULES

1. The right to use a privately-owned golf cart is a non-transferable and non-assignable personal right.
2. Privately owned golf carts must be electrically operated.
3. All private carts must be registered with the pro shop before using for play on the golf course. You will then be issued a sticker to be placed on your cart.
4. An annual trail fee for privately owned golf carts shall be established from time to time by the Club Management. The private trail fee is non-refundable.
5. The trail fees shall not be prorated, except for the first year a member applies for a private golf cart privilege.
6. Members using a private golf cart will be held fully responsible for any and all damages caused by the misuse of the golf cart by the member, his or her family or guests, and the member shall reimburse the Club for any and all damages the Club may sustain by reason of misuse, including without limitation, damage to other golf carts and any property of the club.
7. The annual trail fee includes only the member, spouse and the member's children under the age of twenty three who are living at home or attending school. All such persons must have a regular driver's license and be named in the trail fee agreement. Other family members and guest must pay appropriate cart fees.
8. Members with private carts may ride with each other, but may not loan their carts to other members or to guests except as permitted as provided in the Golf Cart Trackage Agreement.
9. When one registered family member is using the registered cart and another registered family member is playing in a different group. That family member may use a Club cart at no charge. If a registered cart is out for repair, the registered member may use a Club cart at no charge.
10. Members with a private golf cart must check in at the pro shop prior to beginning play.
11. No privately owned golf carts will be stored, charged or maintained by the club at any time, unless otherwise authorized by Club Management.

12. When a member-owned golf cart is no longer used in the private golf cart program, all Club Stickers and decals must be removed.

13. Members with private golf carts are required to ensure that their private golf carts are restricted to licensed drivers who will operate the golf cart in a safe, prudent manner, and in accordance with all governmental regulations.
