


LETTER FROM THE HEAD GOLF PRO

Recently, I have received a few questions about posting scores and establishing a valid handicap. Many of you are probably aware of the changes to handicap posting from 2019 and this information may be redundant. For those who may not be aware or others that need a refresher, I apologize for not getting this important information out earlier. But as my mother told me years ago; "Better late than never". A lot of the info I am going to touch on can be found on the USGA website

First off, there are many reasons to establish a USGA handicap. The two biggest reasons I like are:

- 1 A handicap index is always changing on how you as a golfer are either improving or needing a little work. It is a direct reflection of your playing ability.
- 2 A handicap allows golfers of all abilities to compete against golfers of different abilities either in competitive matches or casual games.

It is important to know a few topics when posting scores. I am going to cover 5 topics.

- 1 -Post every score. A Handicap Index is updated every night averaging your 8 best Score Differentials from your most recent 20 scores. It is important to post every score (good, bad, or indifferent) to give us the best reflection of our current abilities. Players may post 9-hole scores as well as 18-hole scores.
- 2 Difference between Handicap Index and Course Handicap. A handicap index is a portable number while the course handicap is a direct number for the course and tees playing established against par. For instance, John may have a 17.2 handicap index but when John plays the 3 star tees at Spring Creek, he has a course handicap of 21. The course handicap is important to know where you are receiving strokes based on the course stroke allocations.

- 3 Maximum Score. A net double bogey is the maximum score allowed for all golfers for posting purposes. If John has a course handicap of 21, he will receive 1 stroke on every hole and 2 strokes on the 3 lowest stroke allocated holes. Since #6 has the lowest stroke allocation, John would get two strokes on that hole. Meaning the maximum score John could take on hole #6 would be an 8 (Net Double Bogey).
- 4 If you don't play a hole. For instance, due to darknessor weather, the score recorded is net par. If John couldn't finish #18 because of weather, he would take par plus any strokes received. Since John is a 21 course handicap and #18 is the 6th stroke allocated hole, John would take a bogey. One stipulation for posting scores with unfinished holes, you must play at least 7 holes to post a 9-hole score and 14 holes to post an 18-hole score.
- 5 If you start but don't finish a hole. For instance, because a putt is conceded during match play, the score recorded for handicap purposes would be your most likely score. If John has a putt from ten feet for par and picks up because his opponent made a birdie, John will take a score of bogey (assumed two putts from ten feet).

One of the great things about golf is the integrity of the game. It is one of the only sports where the player is the official or umpire. It is a game where all players can compete with and against other players of different abilities. It is a game where players can compete with or against other players of different ages and genders. It is a great game.
