



These rules have been adopted to enhance the enjoyment of the Club by all members. Please take the time to familiarize yourself with them. All rules of Spanish Wells Golf and Country club are applicable always whether posted on the club property or listed on the Club website.

GOLF COURSE

A. GENERAL GOLF RULES

1. Each member and each guest must enter the pro shop and sign in before beginning each round of golf.
2. Players should pick up their tees and broken tees and discard them in the tee receptacles.
3. Players should repair their divots and repair their ball marks on the greens.
4. Players should rake bunkers and enter and leave bunkers at the lowest point. Rakes should be left inside the bunkers with the handles perpendicular to the edge of the bunker.
5. Practice is not allowed on the golf course. Only the driving range and at the hitting stations or short game area only. Practice putting greens and chipping greens must be used for all practice.
6. If a foursome or other group of players fails to keep its pace on the course, that group may be asked to kindly, step-aside as to let faster players/groups through. The same may happen when players stop to search for a lost ball.
7. All players who choose to stop between nines, for any reason, will lose their position on the golf course. To re-enter the course, it will then be up to the starter to try to fit them back into the rotation.
8. Golf rangers are on duty to help regulate play and enforce golf cart regulations. The golf rangers have full authority on the golf course to enforce all rules and speed of play. Your cooperation is appreciated.
9. Each player must have his or her own set of golf clubs.
10. Appropriate golf attire is required for all players. (See the separate Dress Code below) This dress code is mandatory for all players. Improperly dressed golfers may be asked to change before playing. If you are in doubt concerning your attire, please check with the pro shop before starting play.
11. If lightning is in the area, all play shall cease. The ultimate responsibility for an individual's protection and safety is the responsibility of the individual.
12. The Golf Professional in conjunction with the Golf Course Superintendent may close the golf course to play whenever the grounds could be damaged by play.
13. If necessary, during any peak period, twosomes may and will be paired with others. Foursomes shall have the right of way.
14. To provide the utmost playing pleasure for all members, the Club reserves the right, from time to time, to establish rules governing access and starting time with respect to the golf course.

15. The golf course is for golf play only. Jogging, bike riding, skateboarding, skating, walking or any activity other than golf is not permitted on the golf course from dawn to dusk unless authorized by the pro shop. Fishing is only permitted in lakes on courses not actively being used for golf at that time.

B. GOLF STARTING TIMES

1. Starting times may be obtained by calling the pro shop not earlier than the permitted days in advance.
2. All golfers must be ready to play 15 minutes prior to their starting time.
3. All golfers must notify the Pro Shop 24 hours in advance to cancel their starting time if they are unable to play.

C. RAIN CHECK POLICY

When rains prevail and cause termination of play, a player will be entitled to a rain-check or a partial credit for that day's greens fees and golf cart fees only to the extent provided by the Club's rain-check policy in effect from time to time.

D. DRIVING RANGE

1. The driving range is open during normal operating hours as may be posted from time to time in the pro shop. At times to be posted in the pro shop, the driving range will be closed for general maintenance.
2. Range balls are for use on the driving range only and may not be used on the golf course.
3. Balls must be hit from designated areas only. The area between the short range and the driving range is to be used for instructional use only. No hitting is permitted from any other area of the driving range.
4. Proper golf attire is required at all times on the driving range. (See the Dress Code)
5. All driving range signage must be strictly adhered to.

E. GOLF COURSE ETIQUETTE

1. "Ready Golf" is encouraged.
2. Persons using the golf course should do their part to make a round of golf at the Club a pleasant experience for everyone. We suggest the following:
 - a. Do not waste time. Anticipate the club or clubs you may need and go directly to your ball. Always be near your ball to play promptly when it is your turn. Do not hesitate to play out of order as "pace of play" is of utmost importance.
 - b. The time required to hole out on and around the green is a chief cause of slow play. Study and clear the line of your putt while others are doing the same. Be ready to putt when it is your turn.
 - c. Be sociable but reserve your extended conversation for the 19th hole.
 - d. When approaching a green from the fairway never leave the golf cart in front of the green. Use the cart path as much as possible.
 - e. When play of the hole is completed, leave the green promptly and proceed to the next tee without delay. Do the scoring for the completed hole while at the next tee.
 - f. The golf rangers will report slow play and all breaches of golf etiquette to the Head Golf Professional, who will take the appropriate action.
 - g. Behavior such as rudeness, shouting, cursing, club throwing, etc. on the course is unacceptable.
